Dear Stakeholders,

Our commitment to sustainability is underscored by our vision, "To be an accelerator for a sustainable Africa." We strive to promote sustainable practices throughout our operations and the supply chain. I am pleased to share with you our sustainability report for **2024**. The report highlights our impact on the environment, people, and the economy.

Contributing to Uganda's Economic Growth

Our value addition in 2024 is UGX 336.6 billion. In 2024, we continued with the construction works and completed 80% of two expansion projects at Roofings Rolling Mills. The new state-of-the-art Cold Rolling Mill Complex will bring our total annual production capacity of Roofings Group to 625,000 tons per annum. This is an important development as the current cold rolling mill which is in operation for over a decade contributes 54% value addition. Doubling the cold rolling mill complex production to 300,000 tons per year, implies a significant potential for Roofings Group to increase the monetary value addition at the same rate of 54%.

Protecting the Environment

Our factories were audited by environmental sustainability experts and the annual compliance audit reports were

submitted to NEMA. Our environmental management systems were recertified by NEMKO AS and found to be compliant. Our Integrated Management System Policy emphasizes environmental protection and resource conservation. We aim for zero waste to landfill by applying reduce, reuse, and recycle principles. In 2024, we donated 262,685 tree seedlings to various organizations, bringing the total to over 1.76 million since 2012 in our effort to re-green Uganda. Our target is to achieve 10 million trees by 2030. At an average cost of a seedling of UGX 1,500 UGX; the value of the seedlings given in 2024 is over UGX 500 million UGX, while over the years, since 2012 this value is over UGX 2.6 billion UGX

Impacting Communities

The two expansion projects created numerous job opportunities, increasing our workforce to **2,224** an **18.8**% rise from the previous year. We invested in impactful health and education projects. We donated **123,212** oxygen cylinders to hospitals since **2021** to date, saving lives in the communities and reducing the cost of healthcare nationwide. Our partnership with a local NGO produced and donated **68** wheelchairs for children in need. Aside, we support several other initiatives in the area of health to include the Sickel Cells Foundation in Uganda, and blood donation mobilisations.







Our corporate philosophy and policy have been formulated in the Vision, Mission and Values, that serve as the guiding principles to all our stakeholders in achieving the environmental, social and economic goals. I am pleased to share Roofings Group's 2024 Sustainability Report , detailed account of how we integrate sustainability into every layer of our operations and value chain.

Guided by our vision "To be an accelerator for a sustainable Africa," this report highlights our growing impact across three critical dimensions: environmental, social and governance. Our sustainability strategy is not only a responsibility but a roadmap for long-term resilience and innovation.

Last year, we advanced key expansion projects, with 80% of construction completed on two major facilities, like the new cold rolling mill complex (phase 4) and a wirerod mill at Roofings Rolling Mills. These projects have already generated new employment, contributing to an 18.8% increase of jobs created, now totalling 2,224. Importantly, they position us to meet regional demand more sustainably, with improved efficiency and lower emissions.

In terms of trade, Roofings Group contributed **2.8**% to Uganda's total exports to the East African Community (EAC), and **0.8**% to the country's overall exports,

reinforcing our role as a key industrial player and export champion. This makes Roofings Group a major export powerhouse for Uganda and with the expansion highlighted above, will significantly increase the contribution to exports, going forward.

We are proud of the progress we've made in environmental compliance. Our plants were audited and certified for sustainability performance, and we strengthened our Integrated Management System with a clear focus on resource conservation. Notably, we donated over **262,000** tree seedlings in **2024** alone, a critical step toward our goal of planting **10** million trees by **2030**.

Our social impact continues to grow. We supported healthcare by donating over **23,212** oxygen cylinders in **2024** and our wheelchair partnership produced and donated **68** wheelchairs to children and adults bringing dignity and mobility to those in need. Our continued support to the sickle cells foundation is motivated to reduce the impact of the condition as we continue to impart knowledge about the ailment alongside financial and physical support to avert the spread.

As we expand, we remain deeply grounded in the belief that industrial progress must go hand in hand with social development and environmental protection. I extend my sincere gratitude to our employees, partners, customers, and community stakeholders for supporting our mission and for walking this journey with us.

1. Environmental Impact (SDG 13, 15, 07 and 12)



Environmental Management System



We continue to implement and maintain an Environmental Management System (EMS) in accordance with the requirements of ISO **14001:2015**. It is audited annually both internally and by NEMKO AS. The EMS includes trained and competent aspect teams responsible for identifying significant environmental aspects and assessing their impacts, ensuring knowledge transfer and accountability across the organization.

We are proud to have received the **2024** Environmental Sustainability Award from NEMA, acknowledging our continued commitment to air quality management and environmental protection. This award further affirms our commitment to environmental stewardship and supports national goals for cleaner, safer, and more sustainable industrial development.

Environmental Management Policy


Environmental related issues are dynamic, and this compels us to review and evaluate our environmental management policy annually, to align it with the operating environment. Key focus areas include Compliance to statutory and regulatory requirements, Climate Change related issues, Resource Depletion, and environmental pollution while emphasising circular production.



Energy and Emissions

Our operations are primarily powered by hydroelectric energy, which accounted for 90% of our total energy consumption in 2024 — a reflection of our commitment to cleaner energy sources. During the year, hydropower usage increased by 30.85%, reaching 85.136 GWh, driven by the scaleup of production and expansion projects. In addition, LPG consumption rose by 5.12%, supporting key operational needs while contributing to cleaner combustion compared to conventional fossil fuels.

Wherever feasible, we prioritize renewable energy sources and continue to invest in energy-efficient technologies to reduce overall environmental impact. We have also strengthened our air emissions management through the installation of advanced pollution control systems such as Scrubbers and Regenerative Thermal Oxidizers (RTOs), which are critical for reducing volatile organic compounds (VOCs) and particulate emissions. As part of our environmental strategy, we continue to develop and implement targets aimed at reducing our carbon footprint, in alignment with national and global climate goals. These initiatives support our broader commitment to SDG 7 (Affordable and Clean Energy) and SDG 13 (Climate Action)





Resources & Waste Management

Our approach to resource and waste management is guided by the principles of reduce, reuse, and recycle, with a strong emphasis on material efficiency and responsible disposal. Wherever possible, we prioritize the reuse and recycling of materials to minimize waste generation. For waste that cannot be reused or recycled, we ensure safe and compliant disposal guided by the NEMA regulations and through licensed and NEMA-certified waste management contractors.


In **2024**, the total volume of materials used was **274,395** metric tons. We improved our material efficiency to **97.60**%, up from **96**% in the previous year, reflecting enhanced resource optimization and operational sustainability.

Our continued commitment to efficient resource utilization supports SDG **12**: Responsible Consumption and Production, while also reducing the environmental footprint of our operations.



By-products Re-used:

By-products like mill scale (1,502.91 MT), slag (1,294.14 MT), and red oxide (1,109.5 MT) were reused in road construction or sent for research in partnership with Makerere university.



▲ Waste Acid diverted from disposal:

All spent acid from pickling process is regenerated at our Acid Regeneration Plant to produce quality acid for re-use. Such technologies have enabled us to prevent environmental pollution and protect the communities.



Recycled by-products:

Recycled steel byproducts totalled 20,355.98 metric tonnes and plastic byproduct rose by **71.8**% to **67** MT.



Waste directed to disposal:

In 2024, we disposed of 478.68MT of domestic waste, 14.2MT of APC Dust, and 1,109.5MT of Red Oxide. These serve as byproducts in other value chains and we continuously engage the academia, science and technology to develop value chains using these associated by products.

Water and Effluent Management



Water Consumption:

Water consumption decreased by 2.25% in 2024 to 237.04 megalitres. This is an indication of improved water efficiency and despite of the increase in production.





Water Discharge:

Effluent discharge reduced by **3.98**%, and we continued expanding our Effluent Treatment Plant (ETP).

We recycle **2,628** megalitres annually in our hot rolling mill, achieving a water use rate of **0.63** m3/ton—well below the industry average.


Biodiversity and Climate Action

Through our Forever Forestry Programme, we donated **262,685** seedlings in **2024**, bringing the total to over **1.76** million since **2012**. We work with local partners and NGOs to promote regreening and biodiversity conservation. This initiative plays a key role in supporting reforestation, biodiversity conservation, and carbon sequestration across Uganda. We are committed to reaching **10** million tree seedlings by **2030**.

To ensure effectiveness and accountability, we conduct regular monitoring and evaluation of selected reforested sites. These assessments indicate an average seedling survival rate of approximately **70**%, underscoring the programme's strong impact and sustainability.

We operate a seedling nursery situated at our Lubowa factory that produces various species of trees including mangoes, jackfruits, avocados, Markhamia Lutea (Musambya), Maesopsis Eminii (Musizi), Prunus Africana (Entasesa), Terminalia Superba, and Grevillea Robusta.

Our efforts contribute to SDG **13** (Climate Action) and SDG **15** (Life on Land), reinforcing our role in building a greener, more climate-resilient Uganda.

We provide full-time employment with no part-time staff. In 2024, (we employed 2,224 jobs created-rephrase), with 16% of outsourced workers being female—up from 14% in 2023. Our HR policy complies with all labour laws, benefits include healthcare, medical insurance cover, terminal benefits, parental leave, Workman's Compensation (disability and invalidity coverage) and transport allowances. We emphasise equal opportunities and in turn mitigating potential biases fostering a fair and inclusive workplace.

The OHSMS covers permanent employees, outsourced workers, customers and suppliers. Aligned to our target of zero fatalities, there were no fatalities reported in **2024**. Hazard Identification, Risk Assessment and Incident Investigation:

We conduct HIRA reviews on regular basis and safety awareness trainings. Safety signages and firefighting equipment are installed at designated locations to create more awareness to whoever accesses our facilities. Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) from our suppliers are available to employees that have access to and get into contact with hazardous materials at the stores and production operations.

Occupational health services and Employee Well-being:

Our entities maintain well-equipped in-house clinics. We provided free screening, consultation, counselling and welfare services to all employees.

Workers' Participation and Consultation:

We promote workers' participation in health and safety activities across all our entities including the Outlets. We apply Toolbox Talks and planned safety meetings as essential tools for consultation and communication among the workers. This is coordinated by EHS Officers and Human Resources Department for each of the entities under the Group.

Workers' Training in Occupational Health and Safety:

We maintain an approved annual training plan for all trainings, both internal and external. In **2024**, we selected a team of workers to attend training in Understanding the Implementation of the requirements for ISO **45001**:2018, facilitated by UNBS.

Human Rights

We uphold international human rights standards and enforce zero tolerance for child labour or discrimination. Our HR systems incorporate due diligence to monitor compliance.



Training, Development and Career Advancement

At Roofings Group, we believe that continuous learning and career development are fundamental to building a capable and future-ready workforce. In 2024, we implemented our Annual Staff Training Plan, which included a blend of internal and external trainings focused on key areas such as ISO standards, managerial competencies, and technical upskilling related to machinery installations. These sessions are designed to enhance both operational efficiency and leadership capacity across the organization.

Industry-Based Training & Workforce Empowerment



In February **2024**, Roofings Rolling Mills (RRM) was officially accredited as an Industry-Based Training Institution (Centre No. UVQF/**5822**) by the Directorate of Industrial Training (DIT), Ministry of Education and Sports. This accreditation qualifies RRM as a Training and Assessment Centre under the Uganda Vocational Qualifications Framework (UVQF) for Category IBL – Levels **1** to **5**. Since accreditation, **225** RRM staff have successfully completed competence-based training and assessments across **11** key industrial occupations, including:

This milestone underscores our commitment to capacity building, skills development, and creating a technically empowered workforce aligned with national goals for industrial transformation. All **225** trainees are now ready for graduation, having been assessed and certified within just one year of accreditation.

Our Human Resources policy prioritizes internal career advancement, with clear pathways for promotion and development within the Group. This approach not only motivates our workforce but also ensures institutional knowledge is retained and nurtured.

We also continue to invest in youth empowerment through structured internship programs.

In 2024, internship enrolment increased by 28.4%, reaching 131 interns, of which 70 were female, representing a significant 105.88% increase in female participation compared to the previous year. This reflects our commitment to bridging gender gaps and building an inclusive talent pipeline.


Free Oxygen to hospitals



Driving Economic Growth

The steel industry plays a pivotal role in driving Uganda's economic expansion and holds the promise of becoming a cornerstone for its financial well-being. Beyond its fundamental importance in construction and infrastructure. steel serves as a catalyst for diverse manufacturing endeavors, fostering innovation and opening avenues for creative solutions across various sectors. Roofings Group, as the leading steel manufacturing company in Uganda, is proud to contribute 2.8% of the country's total exports to the East African Community.

Value addition

In **2024**, our value addition experienced is at UGX **336.6** billion. This can be attributed to Uganda's strategic policy of encouraging Ugandans to appreciate the locally made goods to enhance economic sustenance of local businesses. Additionally, the encouragement for manufacturers to procure intermediary goods and inputs from fellow manufacturers within the value chain has played a significant role. As a result, the composition of goods sold by Roofing Group has enhanced the product and service solutions offered to include fellow manufacturers.

Roofings Group continues to play a pivotal role in Uganda's economic development. As the leading steel manufacturer, we contribute 0.8% of the country's total exports. Our value addition in 2024 was UGX 336.6 billion, an increase from UGX **325** billion in **2023**, reflecting a **3.57**% growth. In the Cold Rolling Mill Complex, our value addition is **54**% from the primary input to the final product.

Exports

The gross export value for 2024 stood at UGX 264.4 billion (2.8% of EAC and **0.8**% of total exports), contributing significantly to the country's foreign exchange earnings. Export sales generated UGX 61.8 billion in value.

In 2024, Roofings Group paid UGX 179.6 billion in taxes, maintaining our position as one of the highest taxpayers in the manufacturing industry. We also contributed UGX 9.3 billion to the National Social Security Fund (NSSF), which is a 12% increase from 8.3 billion of 2023.



Support to Local Manufacturers

We supplied raw materials and inputs to 96 Ugandan manufacturers in 2024. This initiative fosters value chain linkages and promotes domestic industrialization.

Our power consumption for the year was valued at UGX 34.8 billion, emphasizing our scale of production and commitment to contribute to other industries.
